About Chab Dai

In Khmer, *Chab Dai* means *joining hands*. The vision and mission behind Chab Dai was founded in Cambodia in 2005. In addition to Chab Dai's work in Cambodia, Chab Dai also works in the U.S., Canada and the U.K.

Chab Dai Coalition is based in Phnom Penh, Cambodia and led by four national directors, with a team of 37 staff.

We are devoted to seeing Christians work together to end abuse and trafficking. Within the coalition, we have 52 members involved in prevention, intervention, aftercare, reintegration and socially responsible business.

Our Ethos for Collaboration

We believe collaboration is critical if communities & organizations are going to see change on a large scale. At this year's bi-annual member meetings, we focused on:

Strategic Thinking & Vision

In November we collaborated on “**Strategic Thinking & Vision**” and 40 member organizations were presented with certificates for their **commitment to excellence** under the Chab Dai Charter. The coalition also collectively chose five member forums to focus on for the upcoming year, including: leadership, prevention, aftercare, family, and community-based care.

Family & Community Focus

In May, members discussed community-based interventions and programming for addressing human trafficking, including prevention, aftercare, & reintegration strategies. On Day 2 the Royal Government of Cambodia was invited to network with members, and share about updated reintegration and community-based care policies.

1 COLLABORATION & MEMBER SUPPORT

Learning Community

- ✓ The coalition grew to **52 member organizations**
- ✓ Continued to **build bridges** with UN agencies, NGO partners, and the Royal Government of Cambodia, including the National Committee to Suppress Human Trafficking
- ✓ Added **170 new resources** to our library
- ✓ Trained members about National Minimum Standards, Child Protection, Human Trafficking, and Leadership
- ✓ **Hosted 7 trainings**, impacting a total of 150 learners
- ✓ Facilitated 5 **forums** (Aftercare, Community Based Care, Family, Leadership and Protection), involving a total of 249 participants

Chab Dai Charter

- ✓ 40 members have now **signed** the Chab Dai Charter
- ✓ Over 20 members completed the Chab Dai Charter **Assessment**
- ✓ Hosted 2 feedback groups on the Charter process
- ✓ Began follow up on members' Improvement Action Plans

Doorsteps

- ✓ **Trained 103 Cambodians** about Project Cycle Management, 7 Habits of Highly Effective People, Livelihood Development, Learning to Learn, and Leadership
- ✓ **Supported 14 organization leaders** through Quality Improvement Systems (QIS) training to help holistically improve their organizational standards

Jeut Nung Dai

- ✓ Trained member staff in 4 provinces about Social Work, Child Development, Trauma, Counseling, Conflict Resolution, Family Mediation and Supervision
- ✓ Filled a huge gap in Cambodia by providing **156 social workers and counselors** with training

2 PREVENTION & INTERVENTION



Community Prevention

- ✓ Urban & Community Prevention programs trained **465** community leaders including pastors, teachers, government officials, monks & organization staff
- ✓ The Vietnamese Prevention program trained **6,045** children & adults about trafficking and child protection in 4 provinces including Phnom Penh, Kandal, Koh Kong, and Kampong Cham

Community Hero Project

- ✓ Trained 25 local heroes who educated **5,519** villagers in **100** villages across 5 provinces

Case Support

- ✓ Between June 2011 to May 2012, the team received **75** cases from **15** provinces and **4** countries (Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia and South Africa)
- ✓ Over **101** cases were reported and then referred to legal and social service partners



Story of Hope

My name is Te Yeoun. My role in the province of Banteay Meanchey is Chief of Phom Thmei Commune at Thma Pouk District.

Being a Chief of Commune, I always meet with local people in the communities and people in the remote areas. Since my three day training with Chab Dai, I feel confident speaking to my community and educating the local people about human trafficking and safe migration.

It is especially important to let my community members know about child protection and child rights. I really want to express my appreciation to Chab Dai which conducts good workshops. I also want to give thanks to the trainers of Chab Dai who have good talent in teaching skillfully and professionally.

I want to raise my commitment up to bring safety and protection to my community.

Finally, I want to wish Chab Dai's staff to receive good health, wisdom, and peace of mind abundantly.

3 RESEARCH & ADVOCACY

Butterfly Longitudinal Research

- ✓ **Formed partnerships** with 12 organizations to evaluate the impact of current aftercare and (re-)integration programming over 10 years
- ✓ Facilitated **peer-group discussions** about current aftercare programs with girl & boys [see Year 2 Research Progress Report, available at chabdai.org to learn more]
- ✓ Signed consent forms & began interviews and community with **128 research participants**

Advocacy for Migrant Safety

- ✓ Continued to advocate for the safety of migrants seeking employment opportunities in **Malaysia** and increasingly in **Thailand**
- ✓ Active membership in **emerging advocacy networks** in Cambodia, including the Forum to Address Labor Migration & Exploitation, The Cambodian Working Group for Domestic Workers (CWGDW) and the Cambodia and Thailand Anti-Human Trafficking Network (CAHT)
- ✓ Collaborated with the International Labor Organization (ILO) and the Royal Government of Cambodia, as well as other stakeholders, to develop a ***Referral Directory for Returned Migrants and Survivors of Trafficking*** in Cambodia, which maps services by province and encourages community-based support

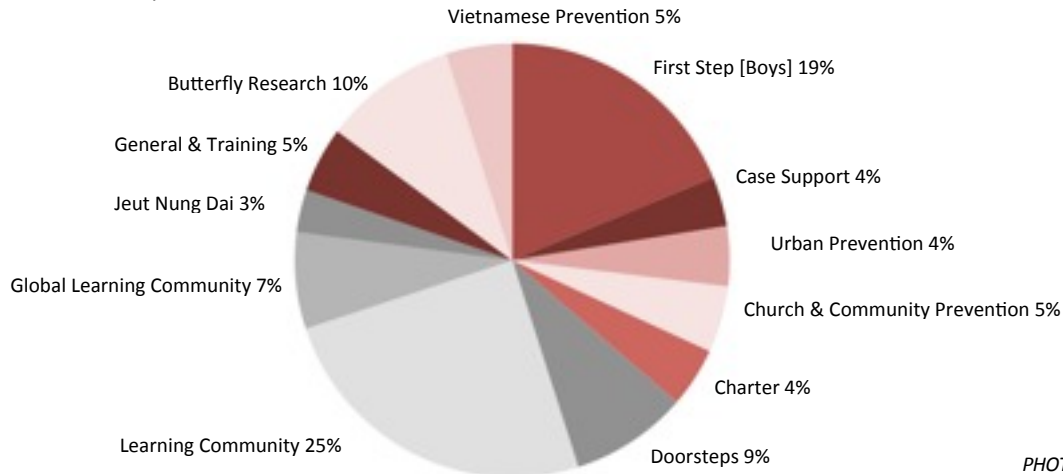
